

**Minutes for the Meeting of  
Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2E**

March 31, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 6:43 p.m. by Commissioner Lewis, Chair. Commissioners Solomon, Jones, Starrels, Steury, and Prindiville were present, constituting a quorum.

**Administrative**

***Approval of March 31, 2014, ANC 2E Public Meeting Agenda***

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve the agenda of the March 31, 2014 ANC 2E public meeting. Commissioner Prindiville seconded the motion. The motion carried with a vote of 6-0.

***Approval of March 4, 2014, Meeting Minutes***

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve the minutes of the March 4, 2014 ANC 2E public meeting. Commissioner Jones seconded the motion. The motion carried with a vote of 6-0.

***Public Safety Report***

Lt. Hedgecock reported 7 robberies of pedestrians in the community in the last month. 4 involved hand guns. 4 victims were lone females at the east end of Georgetown. Also a bank robbery occurred at TD Bank. He added there would be an enhanced presence of MPD in Georgetown.

***Financial Report***

Commissioner Jones reported ANC finances are secure.

***Transportation Report***

Commissioner Lewis urged that citizens call 311 and report potholes for repair and reported that DDOT was responsive.

***Department of Public Works Report***

Commissioner Jones announced the spring clean-up with Georgetown University on April 12 with DPW Helping Hands in partnership.

**Community Comment**

Lee Granados announced the Nike Women's Half Marathon for the weekend of April 27 and 28. Ms. Granados spoke of ways that the Half Marathon is addressing the problems of last year to reduce congestion at Georgetown Harbor and K Street.

John Wiebenson of the Georgetown BID discussed upcoming BID projects, most notably the French Market, April 25 and 26.

Ruth Werner of Councilmember Jack Evans' office announced voting places for the upcoming election.

**New Business**

Commissioner Steury explained the issues regarding fracking in the George Washington National Forest, specifically the use of chemicals close to the Potomac watershed for DC.
